Peace Tree

One of the most popular trees decorated at Christmas time is the eastern white pine.

The tree is called the "peace tree" because it symbolizes the great peace that years ago united the warring tribes of the Mohawk, Oneida, Onondaga, Cayuga, and Seneca into one.

Legend says that an Indian peacemaker named Dekanawidah had traveled among these nations in northeast United States, urging them to stop fighting. He used the eastern white pine as a symbol in his negotiations since the tree's "roots of peace" extended north, east, south, and west. His analogy eventually convinced the tribes to form a five nation confederacy. Tribal chiefs would meet under the peace tree to resolve issues, with weapons being buried under the tree to seal a peace agreement.
