Silent Night....

It was Christmas Eve. The year was 1818. The place was a tiny village in the Austrian Alps by the name of Oberndorf.

The assistant pastor of the local parish was looking sadly out over the snow covered valley, wondering what they would do that evening for Midnight Mass. The pipe organ at church had broken and they would be unable to sing the great Christmas songs that had been their tradition.

The it occurred to him that perhaps there was a way to make do.

He found a Christmas poem he had written at his previous parish. He took it to the parish organist and asked if he could set it to a simple tune that could be played on the guitar. The priest's verses were not great, just true words...and the song was not the caliber of, say, Handel's "Messiah," but it was true music...and there was born that night in that tiny village the beautiful Christmas hymn, "Silent Night."

In the years that followed, the song slowly began to travel by word of mouth as folk songs tend to do. Before long, it was being sung here and there and eventually around the world. But no one knew who wrote the words or the music. And, at that time, the people who wrote the words and the music didn't know it was being sung around the world.

Today, 200 years since its first performance, "Silent Night" has become one of the most cherished Christmas songs.
